

## Zoom B'nai Mitzvah- Aliyah Details

- Before the Bar/Bat Mitzvah:
  - Please ensure that you are comfortable with the Zoom technology
  - Print a copy of the Aliyah blessings (p.2 of this document)
- For the morning of the Bar/Bat Mitzvah:
  - Please log on to the Zoom call at 9:45am

  - Once we have checked to make sure that everyone is present and can be seen and heard, we will be sending some people into breakout rooms.
  - During this pre-service meeting time, you may see a message pop up asking permission for your microphone to be unmuted in meetings hosted by Temple Micah. Please select “yes.”
- For your Aliyah:
  - When it comes time for your Aliyah blessing, we will unmute your audio.
    - If you are doing an Aliyah with others joining from multiple locations, one location must be the leader(s). This likely means that only one household’s microphone will be unmuted; or else, if you’ve practiced together, that all other locations are chanting VERY quietly.
  - After the Bar/Bat Mitzvah student finishes chanting their last line, you will begin the blessing after reading (without prompting from a rabbi).
    - If you are doing an Aliyah with others joining from multiple locations, you may have chosen a different location/household to be the leader of the blessing after.
- Siman Tov u’Mazal Tov
  - We will be collecting celebratory messages in the Zoom chat box during the singing of Siman Tov u’Mazal Tov! If you would like to compose a message ahead of time, please have it ready to copy/paste.
  - As long as your camera stays on, we can see you- and so can the bar/bat mitzvah student! We would love you to participate fully and celebrate enthusiastically during this singing moment.
