

## Deuteronomy 24 דְּבָרִים 24

**יד** 14 You shall not abuse a needy and destitute laborer, whether a fellow Israelite or a stranger in one of the communities of your land.

**טו** 15 You must pay out the wages due on the same day, before the sun sets, for the worker is needy and urgently depends on it; else a cry to the Eternal will be issued against you and you will incur guilt.

**טז** 16 Parents shall not be put to death for children, nor children be put to death for parents: they shall each be put to death only for their own crime.

**יז** 17 You shall not subvert the rights of the stranger or the fatherless; you shall not take a widow's garment in pawn.

**יח** 18 Remember that you were a slave in Egypt and that the Eternal your God redeemed you from there; therefore do I enjoin you to observe this commandment.

**יט** 19 When you reap the harvest in your field and overlook a sheaf in the field, do not turn back to get it; it shall go to the stranger, the fatherless, and the widow—in order that the Eternal your God may bless you in all your undertakings.

**כ** 20 When you beat down the fruit of your olive trees, do not go over them again; that shall go to the stranger, the fatherless, and the widow.

**כא 21** כִּי תִבְצֹר כַּרְמְךָ לֹא תֵעוּלְלֵהוּ אַחֲרָיִךְ לַגֵּר לִיתוֹם  
וְלְאַלְמָנָה יִהְיֶה: vineyard, do not pick it over again; that shall  
go to the stranger, the fatherless, and the  
widow.

**כב 22** וְזָכַרְתָּ כִּי־עֶבֶד הָיִיתָ בְּאֶרֶץ מִצְרַיִם עַל־פְּנֵי  
אֲנֹכִי מִצְוֶה לַעֲשׂוֹת אֶת־הַדְּבָר הַזֶּה: Always remember that you were a slave  
in the land of Egypt; therefore do I enjoin  
you to observe this commandment.
