27 When the boys grew up, Esau became a skillful hunter, a man of the outdoors; but Jacob was a homespun man, keeping to the tents.

28 Isaac favored Esau, because he [Esau] put game in his mouth, but Rebekah favored Jacob.

29 [One day,] when Jacob was cooking a stew, Esau came in from the [hunting] field. He was famished,

30 and he said to Jacob, "I'm famished; let me gulp down some of that red stuff!" (That is why he was named Edom.)

31 Jacob said, "Sell me your birthright here and now."

32 And Esau said, "Here I am going to die; what good is the birthright to me?"

33 But Jacob said, "Confirm it to me by oath here and now." So he swore it to him, and sold his birthright to Jacob.
