Special Guest Artists

Alan Niku

Alan Niku is a filmmaker, writer, and scholar of Mizrahi culture from San Luis Obispo, California, based in Los Angeles. A native speaker of Persian, he spends his time learning related Jewish languages, deciphering Judeo-Persian manuscripts, and interviewing community members about their stories. He also teaches history and Jewish heritage at various levels, and seeks to educate the world about the underrepresented cultures of the Middle East through his writing and films. A student of all kinds of music, including the western and eastern classical music traditions that flavor the sounds of most Jewish liturgy, when asked what instruments he plays, he usually shrugs and says “anything with strings”.

Ayal Tsubery

Residing and innovating in the dynamic New York music scene, Ayal Tsubery, an Israeli bassist and composer, traces his roots back to Jerusalem, where his early love for music was kindled by his accordionist father. As a graduate of the Berklee School of Music with a musical upbringing focused on Jazz, Ayal explores diverse musical territories, influenced by Gospel, Soul, Balkan, Middle eastern styles, and more. Beyond his debut album, "Decisions," and his latest project, Zoo Berries, Ayal showcases his versatility as a studio musician leaving his mark on numerous recordings across genres. Notably, he has backed up top artists in the Jewish music industry and continues to collaborate with musicians in the diverse and dynamic music landscape of New York City.

Philip Mayer

Philip Mayer is a New York City based drummer and percussionist. Over the past few years he has played drums with multi-platinum selling artist Natalie Merchant on her "Three Decades of Song" tour in 2017, and originated the drum book for the Broadway musical "The Band's Visit" which won 10 Tony Awards including best musical, a Grammy for best cast album and an Emmy. With a background in jazz and American popular music, Philip's interest in drumming traditions from around the world has led him to travel and study extensively in India, Israel, Turkey and Spain. And as an expert in arabic and Turkish music, he's performed around the world from the

Presidential Palace in the United Arab Emirates, to the Al Bustan Palace in Oman. In the states he performs with some of the finest musicians in these respective traditions including Bassam Saba and the New York Arabic Orchestra (Fairuz), Michel Merhej Baklouk (Fairuz), Aslihan and Ertugrul Erkisi from Istanbul and many more.
