If they cry out to it, it does not answer; it cannot save them from their distress. (8) Keep this in mind, and stand firm! Take this to heart, you wrongdoers! (9) Bear in mind what happened of old; for I am God, and there is none else, I am divine, and there is none like Me. (10) I foretell the end from the beginning, and from the start, things that had not occurred. I say: My plan shall be fulfilled; I will do all I have purposed. (11) I summoned that swooping bird from the East; From a distant land, the man for My purpose. I have spoken, so I will bring it to pass; I have designed it, so I will complete it. (12) Listen to Me, you stubborn of heart, Who are far from victory: (13) I am bringing My victory close; It shall not be far, And My triumph shall not be delayed. I will grant triumph in Zion To Israel, in whom I glory.
